#### Pastor's Message

Have you ever "thrown" a pot? When clay becomes a pot, it must first have a center. As a potter spins, pushes, and pulls the clay into its final form, it can easily lose its center and become misshapen. If you have ever tried this, you know that creating a pot requires paying attention to the shape and form you are making. When a pot loses its center, it fails to fully be what it is being created to be — a pot, a pitcher, a plate, a thing of beauty, a vessel for others. When we do not live as the people God has claimed us to be, our lives lose their center.

When we worship, pray, grow in faith, serve our neighbor in need, we live out our lives as God has claimed us to do. At the heart of our worship life is Jesus—in word, in song, in prayer, in the neighbor, in water, bread, and wine. Jesus, who embodies forgiveness and mercy, is the heart. Again and again, life becomes misshapen. Again and again, the potter reshapes the clay. The splash of a watery cross, the taste of bread and wine: these things center life in Christ. God's mercy washes over us. God's mercy is implanted in us. God creates life anew; deformed hearts are reformed for works of mercy and love.

#### Bread Sundays, July 25 – August 22

In the middle of the summer we will focus on Jesus as the bread of life. And not just one Sunday, but five! Our focus will be on John 6, where the gospel writer spends the entire chapter repetitively describing Jesus as the very source of our sustenance.

In recent years it seems that many books have been printed which focus on baking vast assortments of breads, from rye to pumpernickel, French to Italian. Each of us has favorite, perhaps it is lefse or pita! What Jesus will teach us in this season of "bread" is a deeper meaning. A longing, both physically and spiritually, for an even more fulfilling outcome than the tastiest assortment of baked bread. The abundance Jesus teaches satisfies hunger, transforms lives and ushers in a new vision of a holy community.

What we will discover on our bread journey are ways we can think about how we and our community can be nourished and sustained by God. And, to imagine how we become vessels of the holy and how to be open to the call of service. How might ordinary gifts of bread and wine, and the gifts of ordinary people, become the ways God's love is multiplied in service for our neighbor, our community, our church and indeed the whole world.


Join us for worship....taste and see that the Lord is good!

#### Home Communion Bread (unleavened)

*Ingredients* <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup flour <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup hot water <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Tbsp Olive Oil <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tsp honey <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tsp salt

Combine ingredients. Knead for 3 minutes. Roll dough to 1/8" thickness. Cut out circles using 1½" cookie cutter. Transfer to baking sheet, prick wafers with a fork. Bake at 400 degrees, 5-8 minutes until just beginning to brown. Will keep for two weeks in container or store in freezer. Makes 8 wafers depending on the circumference

of your circle.
